

St. Patrick Catholic Secondary School and Arrowsmith Program Pilot Project

Introduction

In November 1997, in co-operation with St. Patrick Catholic Secondary School, a seven month pilot project was undertaken. Seventeen students were selected from the grade 9 intake. Initial testing indicated that all of the students had at least 7 of the 9 learning dysfunctions the testing screened for. The pilot project was designed around exercises to work on the following areas: Motor Symbol Sequencing, Symbol Relations, Symbol Recognition and Quantification Sense. The students spent half of each school day working on the four Arrowsmith programs and the other half day in grade 9 credit courses.

Academic Changes

After 7 months of treatment, the average change in course work from term 1 to term 2 was 11%. The following tables summarize the averaged quantitative improvements seen in the students.

Academic Testing

- Reading Comprehension 1.3 grades
- Reading for Understanding 1.0 grade
- Reading Speed 1.5 grades
- Word Recognition 2.2 grades
- Crossing Letters 18 %ile
- Vocabulary 16 %ile
- Visual Memory 15 %ile
- Arithmetic 0.7 grades
- Spelling 0.4 grades
- Differential Aptitude Test Verbal Reasoning 8 %ile
- Clerical Speed & Accuracy 21 %ile
- Test of Written Language Written Language IQ 11 points

Improvement Rating

At the end of the pilot project, the students and their parents were asked to complete a survey to provide a qualitative measure of the effects of the programs. Both groups were asked to rank the perceived changes in a number of areas as shown in the table below.
